My mentor was the best mentor on the planet. He is amazing.

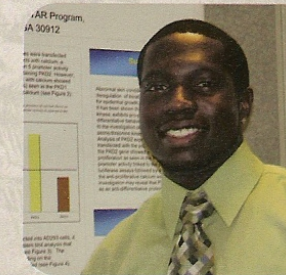
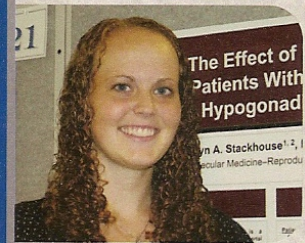
I learned a lot, met some great people and was able to make some connections. More importantly, I found that research is where I want to go with my career.

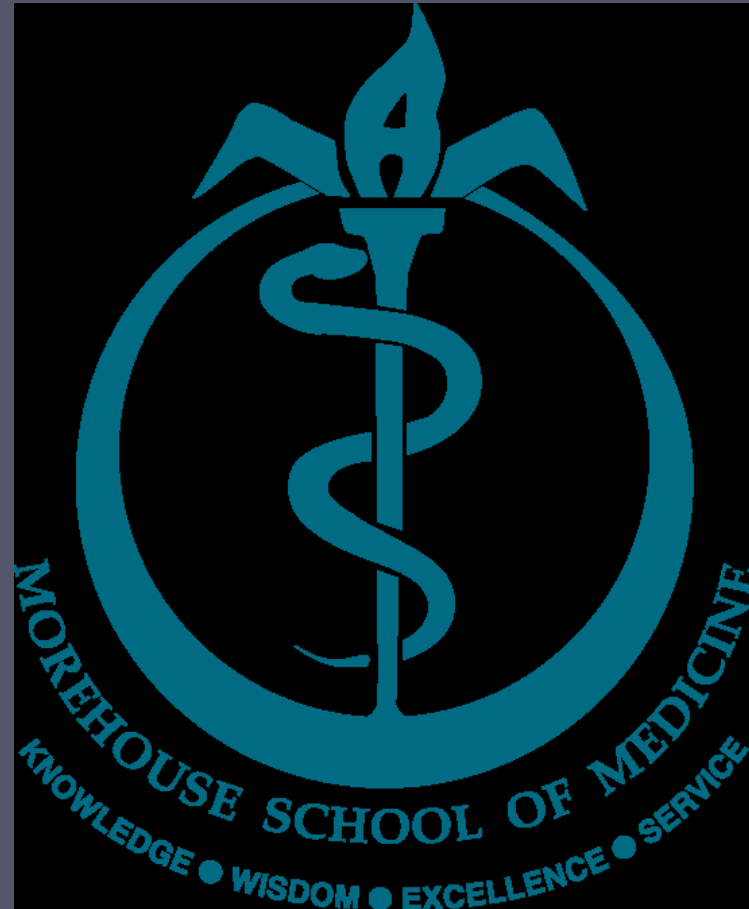
